Who is this course for

- Graduate students, researchers, health or helping professions or others working in health systems, NGOs, or global public health settings who are interested in advancing equity through their work!
- In-person participation is limited to 20 people and Zoom participation to 8.

Course Format

Preparing for KTEA:

- About 10 hours of preparation time to engage in course pre-readings.
- Learners will introduce themselves to others joining the course, and begin the first steps of creating an individualized equity action plan.

Peer Learning Groups:

- Groups of 5–6 learners will be introduced to a community partner to collaborate on a peer/service learning project focused on addressing a real-life knowledge-to-action challenge.

KTEA Intensive Delivery Course:

- We recommend a full commitment to the week (June 10–14th).
- We will meet as a full group every day, using dialogue-based learning strategies (In-person & Zoom).

When and where?

- Module 5 (June 12): Equity-Advancing Approaches & KTA Tools
- Module 6 (June 12): Dialogue-based engagement
- Module 7 & 8 (June 13): Political Context Analysis, Interests and influencers analysis.
- Module 9 (June 14): Review, Synthesis and Action Planning .
- June 14-28: Peer/service learning projects.

Not-for-profit, open-access cost-recovery model
